

Chair's Preview

By the time you read this, we will have held elections for Panel 71. I am writing this a week before those elections, reflecting on the past two years of service – and the gratitude I feel for having been given the opportunity to serve as chair for our Area. These have been two years of tremendous growth for me. My spiritual life has grown, as has my ability to trust the process (even if the process feels too slow or the results are not necessarily what I would like). I look forward to seeing what is next for me and for my friends.

I have full confidence that the next Area Chair will experience similar growth and joy in this service. So thank you for letting me serve.

Now on to our Area's business... Our new Technology Standing Committee has started meeting – and is in the beginning stages of developing a plan of action for what technology needs they will prioritize. At this months' Area Committee meeting, we will hear their second report – and job descriptions for the three other standing committees – Finance, Interpretation and Translation, and Website. The opportunity to serve on standing committees is available to all members of the Area (though there are some specific requirements to serve on the Finance committee). Interested members can contact me through the Area website (or via email) to make themselves available.

At the last Area Committee Meeting, the first draft of a proposed budget for 2021 was presented. This was a unique budget – in part because of the many unknowns (almost all related to the pandemic) next year. We will continue discussing the budget (and possibly approving it) next month. A motion to disburse \$25,000 to the General Service Board was presented; this motion, along with several others, is now under discussion.

We also heard a riveting presentation from Nancy H., the chair of the Pacific Region Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly (PRAASA) 2020, who described the role of PRAASA Chair. She did this because we will be hosting PRAASA in 2024, and we will elect a host committee chair at the November Area Committee meeting.

I look forward to seeing what happens next.

We tried our luck with some singing but we didn't have Liz & Guy yet so we decided it wasn't a God thing. We moved to the Clock Tower in 1986 with beautiful center pieces by Tess & Gerry with tablecloths. Ed was there in Spirit. He died shortly before the 1986 party. We started with Duffy's speaking. Duffy had a voice like Jimbo's. The following year we had Johnny A speak. He had not only an accent but a small voice. We got it. We didn't have a sound system. We proceeded by bring in our own system. The wiring at the Tower was ancient so coffee was difficult. The breakers would continually blow so we started to use thermos. There were a group of people that thought this is not real AA but it is. We stay sober have and A. A. speaker.

We had financial problems. The party was funded by the generosity of the hearts. J.J & Leonard would lock people in meeting and not let them out till we had \$100.00. We then started asking for a \$3.00 donation. Your generous support of the party will allow us to begin to work on 2007 tomorrow.

We would have child care in the basement. The children are an important part of this party. Santa Claus is a regular. Unfortunately or fortunately many of the children are predisposed and this is there introduction to AA. We want them to know that this is a safe place.

Here we go with the infamous L.A Gene and the turkey story. I gave L.A. a turkey to cook for the party. He promptly asked Robert F. if he could eat the turkey. Robert being sober a week said Oh of course. So when I asked

L.A. to bring the turkey he said he had eaten it & to check in with Robert. Having been sober longer than a week I told him that that Dog would not hunt and he would have to replace the bird. Being a member in good standing he replaced it with a 40 lb. turkey. It ceases to amaze me that when I asked for volunteers to cook turkeys L.A. is still raising his hand. We have never had so much fun.

Liz & Tim & Guy blessed us with the music in 2001 at the Camel Barn. The program is always the best with at least 2 months of practice. The best part is that the group is all a part of A.A. family. The talent is awesome and we would never know this about our members. Gina joined the crew and got us together on the food thing. I am sure Rachel is turning over knowing that we have mashed potatoes.

Other important people that have been involved have been T Bill, Dawn & Dan, Karen & Russ, Robert & Terry, John F. Jimmie S

Gina continued to cook for us through 2008. AA people were so enjoying visiting with each other that we decided to give our full attention to that and discontinue the gorgeous music for now. The group decided to prepare a meal that would be totally prepared by the committee. We decided to do tickets for \$10.00 donation and the meal would lean towards the gourmet side. Gary D. offered his expertise in 2009 and 2010. Kim K and Robert & Terry and Jimbo were at the helm.


Star & Jay Bradshaw had a year of sobriety and graciously volunteered to do the party in 2015. They did a great job but once was enough. We were blessed.

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
