Chair Preview: April 2021

We experienced our first Pre-Conference Assembly of Panel 71, we got to see, hear and feel the love, unity and deep thoughts of our Area. Having our Delegate listening to what you had to share from your groups, having my heart and mind deeply fortunate for being able to be a physical part of the General Service Conference process. Also we got a lot of practice voting, heard our first minority opinion of the new panel and passing our first Assembly Business referring to a requests for a pamphlet entitled "Experience, Strength and Hope: AA for the Transgender Alcoholic" be produced. Big thanks to District 08 and all the volunteers helping conducting the assembly.

On other topic, at the Area Committee Meeting we've spent several months discussing a number of motions including the motion related to incorporating CNCA as a California Non-Profit Public Benefit Corporation having a presentation by the ad-hoc committee chair Justin H. from last panel to help understanding the origin and the intention of the motion. We also approved a bid for the 2021 Summer Assembly proposed by District 70, which will be held virtually in August.

Reminding us that we still have work to do with several Old business items; 1.- That CNCA requires affirmation of auto liability coverage for any member or contractor that CNCA reimburses for mileage & 2.- Increase the reimbursement amount for qualified hotel stays from \$100 to \$150 per night. It is very likely that additional motions will be introduced in the coming months, giving us much more to discuss as we strive to make AA the inclusive, welcoming place it can be.

Constructive Criticism

As you continue in service, I encourage you to read Bill's essay on leadership from time to time. This month, a particular passage spoke to me directly:

There are always the constructive critics; our friends indeed... Then there are those whom we like to call our "destructive" critics. They power-drive, they are "politickers," they make accusations. Maybe they are violent, malicious. They pitch gobs of rumors, gossip, and general scuttle-butt to gain their ends — all for the good of A.A., of course! But in A.A., we have at last learned that these folks, who may be a trifle sicker than the rest of us, need not be really destructive at all, depending very much on how we relate ourselves to them.... There are few better means of self-survey and of developing genuine patience, than the work- outs these usually well-meaning but erratic brother members afford us.

I'm not perfect yet, so when I find myself in an uncomfortable spotlight, my first reactions are far from the state of humility—that perpetual quietness of heart—that I would love to possess at all times. But then I can do a spot-check inventory. I can look to the spiritual principles in our steps, traditions and concepts. I can reach out for support from trusted fellow members, including my sponsor and service sponsor, and be open to the lessons.

And in a very recent instance, I was able to have a wonderful discussion with other affected members with whom it is my pleasure to serve. Some of the most difficult conversations can be the most beautiful in A.A., when we bring our best selves to the table in the spirit of mutual respect and love.

I do not always need to reach out directly to another member and try to "correct" them. And I need not carry resentment. I can be grateful for the constructive workouts I receive. And if I ever find myself in their shoes, which I could at any time, I will try to ask myself before I speak, "Is what I am saying true? Is it helpful? Is it kind?"

Pamphlet Highlight



The pamphlet (p-87) contains 12 stores from A.A. members, all who have mental health issues. It also







